

Visiting Fellowship Programme

The Visiting Fellowship scheme offers an excellent opportunity for international scholars to engage with the University of Warwick, United Kingdom. Open to highly distinguished researchers (including policy makers, representatives of the arts, business, government or industry) from around the globe, applicants are invited to collaborate with Warwick academics through this 1-4 week residential Visiting Fellowship programme.

Applicants are expected to:

- Advance emerging or established research collaborations between Warwick and leading researchers outside the UK
- Enhance the scope or impact of collaborative research
- Contribute to Warwick's culture of cross-faculty / multi-disciplinary activity through symposia, seminars or public engagement events
- Incorporate activities tailored to enrich the research and training environment for early career (postgraduate and postdoctoral) scholars based at Warwick
